Learner evidence was in the format of a paper based portfolio system with use of the City and Guilds 2397 logbook as additional cross-reference. Performance based evidence was presented for 301-303 and 305-308. Performance evidence for the occupational competence unit 304 was also present for this learner. Common task - safe isolation was also evidenced.

Learner evidence consisted of; reflective statements, witness testimony, professional discussion, supplementary photographs, onsite observations (1st fix, 2nd fix), declarations of authenticity and performance mapping/referencing documentation.

Direct on-site assessment was noted to occurred on two separate occasions.

The centre logbook approach reflected the required two instances of workplace performance for all units EQA sampled. A full centre devised mapping document also supported the City and Guilds logbook. This was good practice and reflected a good tool to support assessment planning.

The EQA observed the learner undertaking the final practical task from Unit 303. This was the full initial verification and testing of the three-phase test rig. The construction of the rig was fully as per City and Guilds requirements. The learner received an appropriate assessment task brief and was provided with all the necessary tools and test equipment resources. The EQA validated that the assessor provided an appropriate level of supervision to the learner while the safe isolation and lock-off of power was made. The IQA observed the assessment practice being undertaken and recorded the outcomes on appropriate IQA records.

From the evidence seen, this was a good assessment and adhered to the correct application of the award strategy.
